

Meta Remodeling Awards

A Remodeling Awards Program Sponsored by NARI of Silicon Valley

⇒ Judging

All entries will be judged using objective criteria in the areas of problem solving, functionality, aesthetics, craftsmanship, innovation, degree of difficulty and entry presentation. The entries are judged on their own merit, using the criteria, not against each other.

Points will now be awarded on a scale from 1-15:

All entries will be evaluated on:

- 1. To what degree were the expressed needs of the client met?**
 - a. Did the entry describe the client's needs and desires?
 - b. Did the contractor show that those needs were met?
- 2. To what degree does the project enhance the existing structures functionally?**
 - a. Do the room's new floor plans function well?
 - b. Is the counter space or work area adequate to perform necessary tasks?
 - c. Is there good traffic flow?
 - d. Is safety addressed adequately?
 - e. Are the materials functional?
 - f. Is lighting addressed – both general & task?
- 3. To what degree does the project enhance the existing structure aesthetically?**
 - a. Line & rhythm, continuity & repetition, texture, color & contrast, symmetry & balance, emphasis
- 4. Is there evidence of superior craftsmanship?**
 - a. Moldings, woodwork, stairs, cabinetry, countertops, tile, glass, marble, metal, stone, masonry, etc.
- 5. Were innovative uses of material and/or methods of construction used in the project?**
 - a. Are innovative uses evident, or were any described and noted?
 - b. Were difficult obstacles encountered and overcome, or were any described and noted?
- 6. Residential Historic Renovation/Restoration will also consider the following:**
 - a. Were original uses of materials duplicated in the project?
 - b. Were methods of application used to improve or enhance the original style of the structure.
- 7. Residential Architectural Design will be judged on the following criteria:**
 - a. To what degree were the expressed needs of the client met?
 - b. To what degree does the project enhance the existing structure functionally?
 - c. To what degree does the project enhance the existing structure aesthetically?
 - d. Were innovative uses of materials used in the design and/or construction.
 - e. How well do the working drawings communicate the details of the design to the tradespeople and the client.
 - i. How clear and organized are the drawings?
 - ii. Is the existing vs. Remodel project clearly defined?
